What does he want with her now? What can she possibly give him he does not already have?



In asking how we lost our way, in the second part of the book, Sekyiamah looks at the incursion of colonialism and western patriarchal norms into sexuality. This led to our warped ideals of beauty and shame, internalized racism, as well as state and interpersonal violence that stand in the way of sexual liberation. In the third and concluding part, she shows that we can overcome these hurdles by returning to a more joyful and free sexual practice, using practical advice and prompts to chart our own journey.

Part travelogue, part manifesto, **SEEKING SEXUAL FREEDOM** is the bold call to joy and sexual freedom we need today.



In another sense maternity leave is aptly named, because it's a period of leave from all you know: taking leave of one's mind, body, job, and relationships'

When Emma Barnett began her second maternity leave, she realized that, despite having been there before, as soon as her first leave finished the rose-tinted lenses had descended and she immediately forgot what the experience was actually like when you're in it. This collective forgetting, which leads to well-meaning comments such as 'enjoy every minute' and 'treasure this special time', is doing a disservice to women, leaving them unprepared for the more complicated reality of what it means to be on maternity service.

She writes: 'Pain will hurt us until it's taught us enough lessons. Eating Bitter is less something to attain and more a state of undoing. I won't leave these bitter experiences here in this book, though it was cathartic to purge them. I'll host them inside me. They're food for my next self.'
